2017 Annual General Meeting

Our AGM will take place on Monday, 4th December commencing at 7pm (School Hall at Mid Hartley Road). A number of items will be discussed, two of which are expanded upon below – namely, proposed changes to the HDPA Constitution and the future naming of HDPA.

Members will also be asked to vote in a new Executive and new Committee members. All Executive positions are up for election — President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. We will have a number of nominations on the night and would welcome members with new ideas and a willingness to continue the work of the HDPA. Proposed Changes to the HDPA Constitution

Although we made mention of this in our September issue, it is important we mention it again. The HDPA Constitution was last revised in 2011. Since then, there have been amendments to the standard constitution (provided under the Association Incorporations Act) to allow for the use of electronic media and technology in the administration of the Association. We have included these in the proposed changes, as well as, proposed other changes as follows:

- To recognise that we have always had our Treasurer act as Public Officer not the Secretary as currently provided in our Constitution;
- To allow membership of not only residents but also of people owning property in the valley or running businesses in the valley;
- ➤ To introduce a specified delay of 28 days between new membership application and the granting of membership to achieve a better continuity in membership; and,

> To allow members whose membership will potentially be terminated through ceasing to be a resident in the valley to remain members if they wish, subject to the approval of the members (this is picking up a principle we have already adopted in practice)

Any change will require the approval of 75% of members present and entitled to vote.

HDPA Name – Remain or Change?

The word 'Progress' was extensively used in the naming of community based Associations going back to the early part of the last century. We had the Hartley Vale Progress Association, Hartley Valley Progress Association and the Lithgow Progress Association. In 1956, the Hartley District Progress Association (HDPA) was born.

Like its predecessors, the charter of the HDPA was geared towards improving 'the living conditions within the District of Hartley and providing social, sporting and other advantages'. Advancing the cause of the Hartley District was important, with demands for new facilities and new infrastructure catering for a growing population.

But the reality of all this is that the HDPA exists to support the local community in whatever way that is required – that has been its underlying reason for existing. And so, progress is but one component of a community organisation such as ours.

Should the name of the HDPA reflect more about community inclusion rather than progress? That's the question the upcoming AGM will discuss. While the proposed name change might seem insignificant, it matters to those we serve.

Membership - Join the HDPA

Members are the lifeblood of community based organisations and the HDPA is no exception. This is why we have included our membership flyer in the newsletter.

As many of you would know, we get involved with a range of things and endeavour to get on the front foot on the issues that matter to the local community. We have quarterly member meetings, with committee meetings in between.

The First European Crossing of Great Dividing Range

Hartley residents are invited to the dedication of new signage acknowledging the crossing of the Great Dividing Range by Deputy Surveyor, George W Evans on 30th November 1813, who with a party of five was the first known European to cross the Great Divide. The sign is funded by the Lithgow Regional Branch of the National Trust, Lithgow City Council and Bill Hoolihan of Rydal.

The location is The Evans Crossing Memorial, next to 1202 Hampton Road Rydal on Saturday, 25th November at 10.30am. Christmas Cake Recipe

It is not often the HDPA gives out recipes. But given we are coming into the Christmas period, we thought some of you may want to just try a new Christmas cake recipe, courtesy of Kerrie Elgar. Here you go -

Ingredients

- \rightarrow 1kg mixed fruit
- \rightarrow 1½ cups of brandy
- \rightarrow 6 eggs
- → 250 gms of sugar (brown or white)
- \rightarrow 250 gms of butter
- \rightarrow 225 gms of flour
- \rightarrow 1 teaspoon of treacle

Process

- → Soak the fruit in brandy covered for at least 2 weeks (add extra brandy, if required)
- → Beat butter and sugar then treacle, add eggs (1 at a time) mixing well after each
- → Mix in fruit and flour alternating till all together
- → Bake in 22cm/8cm tin (must be lined) at 160 degrees for 3 hours, then 150 degrees for 1 hour – check with skewer
