President's Corner

Since the Annual General Meeting in early December 2016, we've been busy planning for 2017 and responding to local issues.

We have a new Executive and Committee members and we look forward to building upon the excellent work of 2016 and prior.

Improved telecommunications are what valley residents have been demanding for some time. Our survey of October 2016 reinforced this and rated telecommunications the No 1 issue requiring urgent action. As we watch NBN go about their work, Hartley and its surrounds were a forgotten region in terms of next generation technology – that was until Christmas 2016.

Now we have a proposal from NBN before Council for a fixed wireless tower at the corner of the GHW and Browns Gap Road servicing a significant area of the valley. We asked Council and NBN to hold a community briefing since there's been zero consultation with anyone.

We met with the Mayor of Lithgow, Cr. Stephen Lesslie introducing HDPA and discussed a number of issues ranging from the 2016 deliberations on rural residential land through to community involvement in Council subcommittees and LGA wide telecommunications needs. It was a positive meeting and I'm sure this begins a new chapter in our relationship with Council. In fact, the Mayor will address the HDPA at its 6th March meeting. Working with the Hartley Recreational Reserves Trust, we will continue to upgrade the old Hartley public school site along mid Hartley Road. Further, funding for community activities and projects in Hartley will become available in coming months - we will keep you posted. In this digital age, our website (www.hartleyvalley.org.au) will be one of our main communication mediums and I encourage everyone to make use of what is a very good and informative community website. If you're interested in becoming a HDPA member, our website gives you the information you need.

"A preliminary survey of the Great Western Highway between Hartley and Bowenfels has been made by the Main Roads Department with a view to eliminating curves. Although several curves were eliminated a few years ago, there have been two fatal motor cycle accidents at one corner".

There you have it - 79 years later - and the project will be done, curves and all!

Lithgow Council By-election

Its official, the 8th April is the date of the Lithgow Council by-election to elect two Councillors. We all need to cast a vote so make it count. Hopefully, with a full complement of Councillors, we can move forward. The Old Hartley Public School site will again be one of the polling booths opening from 8am through to 6pm. The HDPA will do its customary sausage sizzle, providing people with 'food for thought' from 8am through to 2pm. We look forward to serving you a premium brekky, brunch or lunch.

Proposed NBN Telecommunications Tower

As we go to print, the Lithgow Council has 'called in' the DA submitted by Aurecon on behalf of NBN for a 45m high fixed wireless facility at the corner of the GWH and Browns Gap Road. Across the Valley, telecommunications are a key requirement and bringing the area into the 21st century is widely supported. For too long people in the Valley have suffered with inadequate telecommunications and the HDPA is committed to redressing this. But the NBN tower caught many by surprise since it 'surfaced' during the Christmas period – not a great time to notify residents. The 'calling in' by Council will mean that the Councillors will decide the DA. The HDPA contacted both Council and NBN and requested a community briefing. For what is a significant DA, there's been zero communications. We support and want better telecommunications but equally, we want openness.
